An Act to amend the Criminal Code (medically assisted dying): With the approval of the Executive Committee, the Most Reverend Richard Gagnon, Archbishop of Winnipeg and President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), signed a statement on behalf of the Bishops of Canada expressing their opposition to the re-tabling of Bill C-7, An Act to amend the Criminal Code (medically assisted dying), re-introduced by the federal government on October 5, 2020. FLOURISHING CONGREGATIONS SURVEY RESULTS: 13

This week we begin a review of the Survey Results for the category of **Internal - Engaged Laity**. Parishes are considered to thrive when attendees have a vested interest and active involvement in the life of the parish community. The following survey items provide a sense of the places and spaces where people are connected to parish life (and how often).

"Do you have a strong sense of belonging in your parish?":

49.1% Strongly agree;

29.6% Agree;

19.4% Neutral:

1.9% Disagree;

0.0% Strongly disagree;

0.0% Unsure.

"On average, how often do you attend Mass?":

18.3% More than once a week;

68.3% Weekly;

10.6% 2-3 times a month;

2.9% Once a month;

0.0% Less than once a month.

Respondents were asked to identify which of the following contexts they meet with others in their parish. The eight most cited responses were provided. The following percentages capture people who included those responses within their "top three":

40.7% Mass;

15.8% Social gatherings outside of formal congregational activities;

13.3% Congregational volunteer setting:

11.6%; Small groups;

8.3%; Congregation potluck;

5.0% Knights of Columbus;

2.9% Children's Liturgy;

2.5% Service-oriented ministry in the community.

"Approximately what percentage of your household income do you give to your parish?":

5.9% give 0%;

64.4% give 1-4%;

22.8% give 5-9%;

5.0% give 10-14%;

0.0% give 15-19%;

2.0% give 20% or more.
